


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What I Read (Red) Mini Journal

After rereading too many books, I purchased this journal to help me keep track...not an easy decision either with so many options online and none in stores. It's incredibly helpful. I don't like the extra pages asking favorite books or what I want to write a book about, but they're a small price to

pay. This journal fits easily in a bag for book store trips. There's ample room to make notes (unless you're long winded) and margins to add info, like a page count, series name or number, etc. I've ended up summarizing a series and then listing the following books on the next page, there's room to personalize the space, I guess I'm saying. I do wish there were more pages, it's not even halfway through the year and I've just ordered a second one, even with my space saving methods, 100 pages goes fast...but it beats a generic notebook!

I just bought my second one of these. It takes me about a year to get through it so it works out perfectly for me to look at all the books I've read that year. It works perfectly for what I use it for and that's mainly just to record dates of when I started and finished a book. There's a place for the name of the book, the author and the start/finish dates. There's five stars that you can fill in to rate the book and below is a few lines for your thoughts about the book. It's not really fancy or in depth which I like. It's very simple and cute.

I am an avid reader and enjoy keeping track of what I have read. This mini journal makes doing so easy and handy, small enough to carry in my purse. Friends have liked perusing it and getting ideas about what to read next. If you want lots of space to write an extensive summary and/or assessment of each book, this is not the journal for you, as it is very compact and concise. I looked over a number of other reading journals at my local bookstore, but they were not what I was looking for so was happy to find this one online. I ordered 2 more for my daughter and daughter-in-law.

I read all the reviews of various book journals, ordered 3 and kept this one. It is very portable and simple. The criticism that it's hard to find the special sections like "Recommendations" is valid -- I fixed this by adding my own little sticky post-it note tabs on the edges of pages I might want to be able to find. I find that I don't have a whole lot to say about each book so there's enough room on each page for my needs -- I just make a few notes, I'm not writing a review or complex analysis. If you need prompting questions or wish to write a lot about every book, this one is probably not for you.

So small, so cute, and so perfect. Useful! Just the right amount of room to write a book title and a few quick thoughts. I'm going to buy some as gifts for my bookie friends. Also a great stocking stuffer. I'm a fan. I also think this is ageless and would be attractive to many. The little journal is delightfully not complicated. I can see elderly people enjoying this as a record of what they've read

(light and easy to hold; easy to tuck into a traveling bag). I can also see young girls having fun with this - many schools make you track your book reading. The cute size and happy color feel good. I'd love to see this offered in a variety of colors instead of just the red.
