

## Synopsis

I teach an undergrad intro course in Women's and Gender Studies. I can't tell you how many potential texts I reviewed before FINALLY finding this one, which is the absolute best of the best. The theoretical underpinnings of the book are social constructionism and intersectionality -- and the chapters don't just pay lip service to these theoretical frameworks, they explain them and apply them in ways that make sense to college students. Every week I use selections from three books with each week organized thematically: this text, *The Essential Feminist Reader* (Modern Library Classics) and *The Feminist Utopia Project: Fifty-Seven Visions of a Wildly Better Future*. These books work very well in concert and the students can really sink their teeth into the content. My only complaint with Ferguson's text is it's lack of availability -- it's on backorder everywhere, including on , and there is no e-book version. Get this book. Use it. You will not be disappointed and neither will your students.

Although the book is exactly what I need for my class, the condition of it is not great, even fro a "used" book. There is pink highlighter throughout the book. In some places, there's almost half a page of it. Hopefully, I will not be charged for something that I did not do, once I return it.
