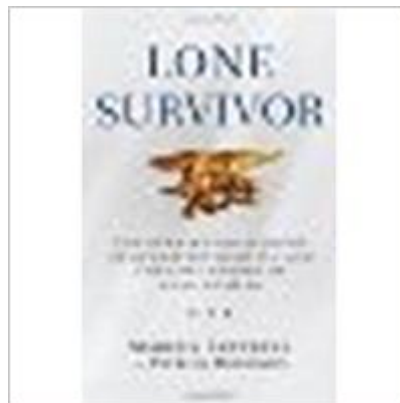

It starts with training and most of the "Can-Do" is mental. Coronado takes its toll, but builds in a resilience that leaves no one behind and everyone covers the team.

Against unimaginable odds, four SEALs find themselves in a firefight in the mountains near Pakistan where they are without air support and are heavily out-numbered and outgunned by a hate driven enemy. It happened because of the Rules of Engagement (ROE), which are designed by suits behind desks and more frequently than not, bring death and destruction on American men and women because the enemy knows what the ROE are also, and they use them to their own advantage. Non-stop action, incredible bravery in the face of certain death, and always dedication and duty, to the Team and the Nation, call the shots. These men are truly a gift to the United States, and we are most grateful for their service and dedication. An incredible accounting and well worth the time.

Fascinating book! Puts us into the minds of soldiers and the brotherhood they adhere to in order to survive and in a sense are addicted. In today's slew of military novels, Lone Survivor stands out as one of those "leading the charge". Set in both the high mountains of Afghanistan, and the sandy, cold beach of Coronado in BUD/s training, this novel shows the trials and tribulations of Navy Seal Marcus Luttrell, both as he watches his fellow sailors quit in training, and his brothers in arms die on the mountain. This gripping tale left me with a pride in the people defending our country, and respect for the training they receive. I found that the book was surprisingly well written, with a good use of vocabulary and conventions. The only complaint that I have involves the length of the book spent on training. A good third of the entire book was spent describing Luttrell's time at BUD/s (Seal Training), and I found that it got fairly repetitive during times. Although, his fast-paced, heart-pumping tone during his time on the mountain most certainly made up for it. Overall, I thoroughly enjoyed this book, and found it extremely hard to put down. The backstory, while slow at times, was interesting to hear about, and the tale of his time on the mountain itself was absolutely gripping. I would rate this book 9/10, although the scoring is out

of 5, so I'll round up to 5/5. Please, do yourself a favor, and read this book!

One of the very best books I have read about the true life account of a Navy's Seal experience in Iraq and Afghanistan. It is heart-wrenching and superior in writing, providing the reader with an in-depth understanding of the SEALs intense training, their resolve and discipline in accomplishing missions, and sadly, his most painful experience in losing his brothers in arms. Being a Christian and a veteran myself, it touched home with me when Marcus recounted how many times God's presence and His grace was with him during all those unfathomable odds in those deadly mountains. How his faith held strong, even when he felt that there was little hope for survival or a rescue mission. There are many moments of tears, pain, joy and admiration throughout the read that one cannot help being fully immersed in his story and I found myself reading long into the night. Additionally, at the end of the book, the reader is provided with pictures and short summaries of his fallen comrades, who he loved unconditionally and is still haunted by their death. These men are real Heroes, and thanks to Marcus, he gave us the opportunity to know and love them more intimately. I am so grateful for all their service and so thankful Marcus shared this true story. What a beautiful way to remember his brothers, a legacy that will be honored by all who serve and I am looking forward to seeing the movie. One will not regret reading this awesome book!!
