This book takes a few new directions and is a great read and moves the story along at a great pace! Another hit from one of my favorite authors. While this one is a little different from the prior books, you still get the same quality writing from the author as well as your fair share of hijinks and action. One thing I didn't like was the multiple view points and jumping around of characters. This made the book feel disjointed at times and somewhat difficult to get traction in. I have to honestly admit that this is the first work by the author that I didn't read in one sitting. And it was not due to the length but more due to the pacing and multiple viewpoints. As in my review title, the book leaves on a huge cliffhanger that wouldn't be a problem, if CF:VI was right around the corner. But it is not, so the reader is left wondering what will happen next for at least 6 months to a year. Sort of game of thrones type ending. Overall another quality entry into the series but not the "best" one ever. Moves the story along and is enjoyable enough...

OMG, really needs to figure out what kind of book they are asking for a review. Where's the category for describing the plot as full of the light and flaky goodness of our lord saviors doughy goodness. Or what about the dwarven battles with a deep seated sexual addiction. And we can't ever forget our ongoing struggles with crap in the pants. I stumbled upon this series only a couple months ago, and I have since plowed my way through all five books, all 4 short story collections, and the Potty Mouth ACLU Special Short Story. OMG, so funny! You can also see how the author has grown and developed as a author. The characters have become more complex, and the storytelling has grown to weave more story arcs together. This is the longest and most compelling story so far, and of course it left off with a MAJOR cliffhanger! I'm hoping CF6 isn't the conclusion. because I really don't want this to end. A must read series for anyone who plays tabletop RPGs while drinking beer, chugging soda, and munching chips and pretzels.

I hate this series. It makes me want to play RPGs again. One could say that it's more of the same, but it's not. Bevan manages to evolve the humor and up the stakes with every book. If you're reading this you're likely already up to your beach in the series. Stop lollygagging and get to reading.

Five books in and I'm still perplexed and a bit disgusted that I like them so much!!The burp and fart jokes still run rampant, but the story itself is still pretty darn good! Original, well-written, and engaging. The characters are believable and well-developed. There are questions left unanswered that leave me wanting more. And that cliffhanger ending! Can't wait for the next!

The series started out strong. Four friends tick off the wrong nerd and find themselves trapped in a game world of that nerd's creation. Who hasn't thought how cool that would be? Now after a few failed attempts to return home to their real bodies, the story has kind of withered. The addition of too many characters, while interesting at first, has brought the story to George R.R. Martin levels of convolution. The many branches of storytelling begin to spiral out of control in Book Five, giving us less progression in the main plot and leaving the reader feeling like nothing is really happening. This also means less time with the original characters we fell in love with. As Cooper would say, "Not cool man." Overall I enjoy the story, but hope for more progression in the future installments.
