

This novel is the best fictions treatment of the battle of Jutland that I have ever read. The confusion, the fog of war, was so palpable that I felt I was there. If there is only one criticism, it is that neither side's gunnery was as accurate as described, although the author's exaggeration in this regard added to the excitement. I recommend this one..

Well written and readable, but you need to know the British Navy's 1916 Jutland events, terminology, and language. The style used to make it a novel was unique.

If I were British or perhaps Scottish, I might have understood more of this. It was a dull read with way too much ink spent on interpersonal squabbles between the characters.
